

Remediation Policy For Block I/Unit I Jointly-Taught Courses

1. Remediation dates will be predetermined and placed on the semester schedule and in the course protocol for each course. In general, remediation exams for fall and spring semester courses will be offered (a) at a date prior to, or on, the first day of classes of the subsequent semester, and (b) in August prior to the beginning of fall semester. Remediation exams for summer semester courses will be offered (a) 2-3 weeks after the end of the semester, and (b) in August prior to the beginning of fall semester.
2. For ANTR 551: Students receiving an N grade in ANTR551 will be required to retake the course - this may be possible in the summer if desired by the student; if that option is not available, the student must retake the course during fall semester.
3. For joint Year 1 courses which offer remediation exams (BMB514, BMB526, PSL534, PSL535, MMG522, NOP552, HM561, RAD553, PHM563):
 - a. Block I students who do not pass a single course (N or CP grade) in any given semester must take the remediation exam at the earliest date possible. If the student is unable to attend this exam at the scheduled time, s/he will need to repeat the course in which the N grade was earned, unless the student receives an excused absence from the Assistant Dean of Student Affairs and Services. In that case, the remediation exam will be rescheduled at a time approved both by the course director and the Block I director (usually at the scheduled date in August).
 - b. Block I students who receive more than one non-passing grade in any given semester need to meet with the Block I Director as soon as possible to discuss the options for remediation for each course (e.g. remediation exam prior to the subsequent semester, remediation exam in August, extension and retaking the course(s)). One remediation exam must be taken at the first offering and a CP grade has higher priority for an early remediation exam than an N grade. If the student is unable to attend the exam(s) at the scheduled time, s/he will need to repeat the course in which the non-passing grade was earned, unless the student receives an excused absence from the Assistant Dean of Student Affairs and Services. In that case, the remediation exam will be rescheduled at a time approved both by the course director and the Block I director.

Suggested dates for remediation exams

- First date for fall semester courses: end of week prior to first day of spring semester classes
- First date for spring semester courses: Friday prior to first day of summer semester classes, or Monday (first day of class)
- First date for summer semester courses: end of second week after the PHM563 final exam
- August exam date for all courses: during the week before start of classes for fall semester
